The Storage Networking Industry Association (<u>SNIA</u>) and DMTF have collaborated since 1999 to advance the adoption of storage networks as complete and trusted solutions. DMTF's alliance partnership with SNIA has provided a channel for DMTF to exchange information on requirements, design input and standards review feedback.

SNIA is a non-profit organization committed to delivering standards, education and services that will propel open storage networking solutions into the broader market. Comprised of some 400 member companies and nearly 7,000 individuals spanning the global storage market, SNIA connects the IT industry with end-to-end storage and information management solutions. SNIA has been working on DMTF's Common Information Model (CIM) and the Web-Based Enterprise Management (WBEM) standards and has been contributing work to DMTF via the Storage Management Initiative Specification (SMI-S), an ANSI INCITS ratified SNIA storage technology based upon the aforementioned DMTF standards. DMTF is also relying on SNIA to supply storage management models for the continued development of CIM. This includes, but is not limited to, the management of Storage Arrays and File Systems, including Network Attached Storage (NAS), iSCSI, Fibre Channel Fabrics, Host based storage and Information Lifecycle Management (ILM).
